Online training through Vector Solutions

Construction across campus

Much of Harper College is getting a makeover!

<u>Primary goal:</u> "The new facility shall provide an atmosphere to support and encourage collaboration with local businesses." The project will be focused on sustainability and LEED certification with: Site development, optimized energy use, indoor environmental quality, and durable materials and resources.

A wide range of programs and departments will go into this building, along with a complete rebuild and redesign of the J theater. Triplin the green space that already exists between I and J. The new classrooms will now face the open courtyard. These redesigns are currently best reflective of current classrooms in the D-wing.

<u>-Canning Center Construction</u>: Connecting power and preparing the site has already begun this fall between the M and A buildings. The I building construction cannot start until the new Canning Center (build onto Building A) is completed. The Canning Center should be completed in fall of 2027, though with that being a capital project, it might take longer.

-Construction of new J building: Demolition of the older J building. Mixed use of I building.

For a clearer understanding, here is a timeline breakdown:

- Construction bids due (spring 2025)
- Board approval (May 2025)
- Move-out building J and theater (June 2025). Construction starts in July 2025.
- Completion, restoration, and installations (Feb 2027 to November 2027)
- Building opens (Jan 2028)
- * Additional note: The I building construction cannot start until the new Canning Center (build onto Building A) is completed. The Canning Center should be completed in fall of 2027, though with that being a capital project, it might take longer.
- Any class that runs in the summer of 2025 will be operating fully online. The BUS/SS division office and staff will also be online. Career and Technical programs will also be affected in some small ways by what is in J, such as studio B.
- TBD for office space, storage, and classrooms for the fall of 2025. Dean Barnes is working with the college leadership this fall to find a future solution.
- * Course scheduling: Other academic divisions across the college will have to share their rooms starting in fall of 2025. 17 rooms (roughly 119 seats) in J and the mega-lab in I building will have to find space across the college for the next two to three years.

Without representation, I choose not to answer any questions." <u>Under no circumstances should you lose your cool or walk out of the meeting.</u>
